EU funded project: Fighting CIDTP and Torture in Ukraine, an Integrated and Intersectoral Approach

Background: With its inception in 2020, DIGNITY together with Ukrainian civil society organizations, SICH and Forpost, has embarked on a collaboration to train Ukrainian actors, both civil society and state authorities, with the aim to improve rehabilitation of torture survivors and medico-legal documentation of torture cases in Ukraine, through building the capacity of health and legal professionals to provide more qualified and skilled redress (rehabilitation and accountability). The project is funded by the EU for two-years.

Timing: The contract period begins 1 May 2020 and ends on 30 October 2021

Objectives of the consultancy assignment:

- Contribute to the development of curriculum and pre-post questionnaires for two trainings on the Istanbul Protocol (IP) and medico-legal documentation
- Deliver parts of two trainings on the Istanbul Protocol and medico-legal documentation
- Develop a standardized method for supervision of IP reports and provide supervision of minimum 10 draft IP reports
- Contribute to the final project report
- Provide recommendations in ways forward by the end of the project

Outputs

1. Draft curriculum and pre-post questionnaires for the two trainings
2. A standardized method for supervision of IP reports
3. Communication and Reporting:

- **7-8 July 2020, a two-day training of 80 legal and health professionals on the international framework around torture and CIDTP, basic skills of identification and interviewing methodology, examination of alleged victims and medico-legal documentation based on the Istanbul Protocol**
